Land use: National: Senate Energy + Natural Resources Committee held 32 hearings on public land bills. This is the precursor to putting together public land bills. NOHVCC had their National Conference in August. They are continuing their commitment in assisting and building sustainable OHV trails.

Dave went to the NOHVCC Special Use Permit workshop last month. It was a very productive meeting. Our goals to bring to the BLM will be:

- Consistency consistency with fees, permit deadlines, etc.
- Singular place to apply for permit ONLINE this will enable access to check status, establish an "Approve by" date. If permit not reviewed in 45 days, it is automatically approved.

Other race organizations have a course marshal called "Independent Monitor" who reviews the course before the race. If we can show consistency with our races with the use of an Independent Monitor, then we can expect the same from BLM.

Thank you in advance for reviewing and considering the following topic.

Topic - Any club putting on two races in one race season.

Issue - Individuals wanting to work only one and race the other.

Suggested solution - I want to give the members of the club the option to work both races, or work one race and race the other. Anyone choosing to work one and race the other needs to have their club place in writing which one they are racing/working prior to the first MRANN race of that season. This will prevent anyone making a last minute decision for a points advantage.

Reasoning for the suggested change - My family is long time Cheaters members, a few years ago we consolidated the Cheaters and Rimbenders. Some of the kids in our club, my 15yo included, has voiced his concern recently about sitting out two races. Jesse told me he would like to work the original Cheaters race at Blue Wing Flat and race the fabulous Moonrocks race. He belongs to MRANN because he loves to race, and enjoys helping out with one race like the majority of the MRANN membership. Even though their is a fair solution in the MRANN rules to average your points for the second race you work, he prefers to only sit one and enjoy the excitement of racing all others.
